

MicroResearch Forum Information Sheet June 6-7, 2022

Forum objectives:

- 1. Provide an opportunity for MicroResearch PIs to present their research
- 2. Encourage networking with other MicroResearchers from East Africa
- 3. Create a dialogue around the forum themes: Networking, Digital storytelling, and Decolonization/Democratization of community-based research

Key presentations

Each section of the forum will begin with a 10-minute presentation on the corresponding session theme: (I) Networking, (II) Digital Storytelling and (III) two talks on the Decolonization and Democratization of community-based research. Each session will be followed by project presentations and a panel discussion.

Participant MicroResearch project presentations:

Potential presenters will be invited by MR or can apply to present through MR (<u>microresearch@dal.ca</u>). Presenters will be the PIs of projects that have been completed or are currently ongoing. Completed project presentations will be allotted 10 minutes, while ongoing project presentations will be allotted 5 minutes.

In order to adhere to the strict presentation time limits, presenters will be asked to submit their PowerPoint with an embedded voice recording of their presentation ahead of time. These will be **due Wednesday June 1, 2022** to ensure adequate audio quality. MR will play each presentation's recording through the Zoom conference call.

In order to apply to present on a research project, please submit an expression of interest to MR by May 20.

Panel discussions:

Panel discussions will be held on each of the three themes: networking, digital storytelling, and decolonization and democratization of community-based research. Each panel discussion will commence with a short presentation followed by African examples with short presentations from MicroResearch projects. After the presentations, the panelists will make general comments on the topic, as well as provide feedback on the project presentation.

Forum attendees/guests:

The forum will also be attended by guests who will not be presenting or participating as a round table panelist. These attendees can register through MicroResearch or their local site organizer. Certificates of attendance will be given to these attendees.
